Ensuring California Climate Policy Protects And Benefits EJ


Communities

Low-income communities and communities of color are disproportionately impacted by climate polluters.

Communities within 2.5 miles of a greenhouse gas facility have:

22% higher proportion of people of color 21% higher proportion of low-income people

The more emitting facilities, the higher % people of color:



Number of GHG facilities within 2.5 miles

#### Impacts and Investments of AB 693



The Multifamily Affordable Housing Solar Roofs program will:

bring solar to thousands of renters while investing millions of dollars into environmental justice communities

lower energy bills for almost 210,000 low-income units

reduce greenhouse gas emissions by up to 3 million tons

dedicate funding of \$1 billion over 10 years, \$100 million per year


New report shows that refinery GHG emissions are correlated with toxic air emissions and other co-pollutants that harm our health.
